Cathryn Ugalde awarded Carol Willessee PhD Scholarship

Congratulations to Cathryn Ugalde (PhD Student; Hill Lab) who on Saturday was announced as the recipient ...of the 2015/16 Carol Willessee PhD Scholarship. This was presented on Saturday at the annual CJD Support Group Network Conference, held in Melbourne, which is attended by families of those affected by prion diseases, health professionals, caregivers, and researchers. Cathryn presented a short talk on her work using organotypic brain slices (a 'brain in a dish' as she addressed the audience) to model prion diseases and identify the mechanisms by which nerve cells die during the disease. The conference gave an opportunity for researchers to hear about the impact of these diseases from family members and also the health implications that surround these disorders.
